Purpose of Title Funding

- The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) was signed into law in 1965 by President Lyndon Baines Johnson, who believed that "full educational opportunity" should be "our first national goal."
- "With this bill, we reaffirm that fundamentally American ideal—that every child, regardless of race, income, background, the zip code where they live, deserves the chance to make of their lives what they will." — President Barack Obama

District Level Funds

- Title I- \$1,959,801
Provides intervention services for students
- Title II- \$215,959
Provides classroom size reduction personnel
- Title III- \$25,432
Provides English Language instruction
- Title IV- \$152,914
Helps fund safe and supportive school initiatives
